







- NAICS Codes

- ➤ The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) classifies business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data related to the U.S. economy. The NAICS industry codes define establishments based on the activities in which they are primarily engaged.








































BECOME LEAD-SAFE CERTIFIED NOW:

Any contractor—plumbers, electricians, HVAC, & painters included—who disturbs lead paint while working in a pre-1978 home, school or day care center now must be Lead-Safe Certified. If you are not, you can face thousands of dollars in fines. Plus you are putting your health, your workers, their families and your customers at risk that could result in lawsuits.

Visit www2.epa.gov/lead to learn about the dangers of lead paint poisoning and the precautions you can take against it. You will also find an EPA accredited trainer in your area where you can be certified. One 8-hour class certifies you for 5 years. It is that easy.

HERE IS HOW:

- 1. Individual renovators must be certified. Get certified by attending a one day Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule Course. The price for this course is set by private trainers accredited by the EPA. To find an accredited trainer near you, visit www2.epa.gov/lead or call: 1-800-424-LEAD (5323)
- 2. Your FIRM must also be certified. Apply for certification by completing and submitting an application and fee.

TEST YOUR CHILDREN & YOUR HOME:

- 1. Consult your doctor for advice on testing your 1 and 2 year old children. A simple blood test can detect lead. Your doctor can explain what the test results mean and if more testing will be needed.
- 2. A trained and certified Lead Based Paint Inspector can tell you if your home has lead based paint by having a laboratory analyze paint samples and by using a portable x-ray fluorescence machine.
- 3. A trained and certified Risk Assessor will take samples of paint deteriorating on doors, windows, walls and floors, samples of dust near painted surfaces and soil in your yard and have a laboratory analyze them.
- 4. Results of reports will tell you if lead is present in your home.
